

How Does Partial Self-Funding Work?

When you use medical services such as a doctor's office visit or hospital admission from a Wellmark provider, your medical provider will submit your claim to Wellmark. Wellmark will process the claim, and then electronically submit the claim to SISCO to process through partial self-funding.

The first bill and explanation of benefits (EOB) you will receive shows what Wellmark paid. You should not pay any amount from this bill.

Wellmark sends the bill to SISCO and Jackson County pays its portion of your bill from Partial Self-Funding.

SISCO sends you a new explanation of benefits (EOB), detailing how much Jackson County (partial self-funding) paid and how much you still owe to your provider (if any).

Your provider should send you a revised bill that matches this explanation of benefits (EOB). If you owe any money at this point, you pay it directly to your healthcare provider.

What if my provider needs proof that I have Partial Self-Funding?

Have your provider call SISCO at: (888) 242-9428

You do not have an insurance card for partial self-funding. Your provider only submits your claim to Wellmark, Wellmark submits all medical claims to SISCO to process through Jackson County's partial self-funding.
