Schloz is asking for the speed limits to be reduced due to 35 miles per hour due to construction of the bridges on both of the roads.

Schloz presented a cooperative agreement for a Competitive Highway Bridge Program (CHBP) project for Chair signature on the bridge replacement on High Bridge Road which is scheduled for a April letting. This bridge replacement project is BROSCHBP-CO49(78)—GA-49 which is bundled with Scott County. He also presented an Iowa Department of Transportation Federal-aid agreement to be signed by the Chair with the federal government paying 55% of the cost of the project.

Motion McDevitt, second Willey to approve the Chair signing both agreements as presented.

Schloz confirmed the date for the 5-year road plan hearing for February 19th and an alternate date for weather of February 27th at 7:00 p.m. at Maquoketa City Hall. Schloz commented that citizens can file road petitions now or at the 5-year road plan hearing, no special form is necessary with only signatures with addresses are appreciated. Schloz commented about an email from Sam Shea on Schloz requesting accident data history from 2014 to 2018 on the bridge north of Preston. McDevitt inquired if there are any suggestions on how to improve the visibility of oncoming traffic. The secondary roads department will be checking the site distance and Schloz noted at the end of the bridge there is a canoe access and field entrance. The Board recognizes the bridge is narrow and may have a sight distance issue and directed Schloz to explore all options to alleviate any issues.

ATV Commission member Steve Tebbe and Chief Deputy Sheriff Steve Schroeder discussed with the board changing the current ATV resolution. Tebbe and Schroeder are suggesting the Board change the times from sun-up to an hour after sun-down to 4:00 a.m. and must cease by 10:00 p.m. They also are suggesting changing the type of ATV or off-road utility vehicle, the size of the engine and the weight of the vehicle. Maquoketa Mayor Don Schwenker addressed the Board and agrees with the changes to the resolution. The City of Maquoketa in November, 2019 opened up all city streets to the use of ATV/UTV's. Schwenker believes this brings in a lot of tourism into Jackson County and he anticipates the City of Maquoketa changing their paperwork to match the county. Chief of Police Lynn Schwager from the City of Bellevue agrees that matching the county resolution with the city resolution would be nice. He noted several items the City of Bellevue is recommending is not included in the county resolution. Schroeder and Schwager believe having set hours is easier for law enforcement to enforce. Schloz is in favor of the ATV/UTV resolution with having no time frame restrictions so they can be used if the county gravel roads are not usable in the spring and is not in favor of the 10:00 p.m. but an earlier time.

Motion Willey, second McDevitt to approve the changes on the ATV/UTV resolution as presented. Auditor Smith commented the resolution has not been prepared due to the uncertainty of the changes.

They also are requesting a traffic count be done for at least 7 days on the Leisure Lake Rd. She spoke of the traffic coming to Leisure Lake or from a near-by hog confinement and surrounding areas who use this road a lot. She also talked about the potholes, the dust and the wash boarding of the road is very hazardous. She is requesting the county provide the dollar amount of money spent on repairing, grading and rocking on the Leisure Lake Rd.

Kory Kuhlman spoke about the maintenance of the road leading to the Bluff Lake Catfish Farm. ECIA did a traffic count of the road in September, 2019 and that shows Monday thru Thursday is an average of 47 cars a day. The ECIA traffic county average county from Friday, Saturday and Sunday is 233 a day. Steines understands the concerns that Kuhlman has but it all comes down to funding. Schloz said that that road gets more maintenance per mile than any other road in Jackson County. Kuhlman would like the county to do maintenance after 5:00 on Friday thru the weekend when the weather permits more maintenance. Steines told those in attendance that the county has added an additional \$200,000 to the rock budget next year. Willey said funding is an issue and the next year budget for rock is \$1.2 million. Kuhlman inquired about the frost boil that happened on the road. He felt what the county did was not enough and considers it a waste.

ECIA will be overseeing the loan program and will charge three (3) percent for services rendered.

The TWB Committee will be applying for a Community and Tourist Attraction (CAT) Grant and is seeking support and approval from the board.
