AGENCY REPORTS

ASAC - Julia Furne, DFC Grant Project Coordinator

A written report (Attachment A12) was provided in the agenda packet. Furne elaborated the CARA grant they are applying for and how it is available to DFC awardees and is an extra \$50,000 that can be used for meth and opioids. She shared a video the coalition made for non-opioid choices in Jackson County. Furne also discussed the compliance checks and the progress that has been made: In 2019 when they began we had a 40% fail rate, but the last two checks done we had 100% compliance both times. No further questions were asked by the board. Furne also stated that a survey will be sent out electronically to the board the next week and asked that they take a minute to fill it out.

Community Health – Michelle Cullen

Written reports from Genesis on Local Public Health Updates and the latest Biweekly Community Partners update were submitted (Attachment A2a / A2b). In addition to the reports she stated that Jen warren has been hired to take over some of Sarah Hobb's responsibilities and is transitioning well into that role. Latham asked if the county had received the Johnson & Johnson vaccine and she said they had not, but the state sent it out to manufacturers and apparently at least one of them was in Jackson county. Latham also asked if special needs individuals and group homes were able to receive the vaccine at this time. Cullen stated that they were open to them in Tier 1a and at the last clinic that was done.

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OFFICIAL MINUTES JACKSON COUNTY BOARD OF HEALTH PROCEEDINGS (APPROVED ON 5-11-21)

SPECIAL MEETING / ELECTRONIC VOTE: March 26 - March 29, 2021

Grandinetti received an emergency variance request for a new well to replace an existing well at 3163 233 Avenue. Driller was uncertain if they would have water available much longer as the pump had gone bad and the casing collapsed to the point the pump could not be pulled/replaced so a new well was needed prior to out next board meeting on May 11, 2021. There also was no other location the large rig could get to. The new well needed a variance to reduce the setback distance from 100′ to approximate 90′ to the neighboring septic. The request was sent out to the board on Monday March 26th not long after the application and request came in via email. The email request included the email thread from the driller, the permit application and a map of the proposed well location and existing hazards (Attachment C2-1). This will be a shared well – both parties are aware of the request as they are family. Driller plans on going at least 100′ with steel casing and a full neat cement grout the entire 10″ upper and large drill hole annulus. Health department supported this variance request with the caveats that the existing well needs to be plugged within 30 days of drilling the new well, annual water sampling of the well water is done, and the casing is fully grouted.

Motion made by Latham, seconded by DeMoss, to approve the variance request to reduce the setback from the well to the neighboring septic field from 100' to 90' with the Health Department caveats in place.

(Motion passed by majority, Becker did not vote)

Note - Driller was notified the variance was passed via phone on the 29^{th} and the permit was issued and sent out on March 30^{th} via email to the driller and the owner.

Happy Monday everyone!

I received a new well construction permit for 3163 233 Ave Maguoketa and it requires a minor variance to the setback of 100' to approximately 90' (neighboring existing septic to new well)

- Reason for emergency: The pump is going bad and can't be removed (damaged casing) we are not sure how long they have before the pump dies and they won't have access to water for them or their livestock. We may not be able to wait until the May 11th meeting.
- Variance Request: Reduce the 100' setback to approximately 90' from the well to the neighboring septic (same owners) - The attached drawing shows that a portion of the existing septic field is within 100' of the proposed well – it is approximately 90'. There is no other location the well can be placed and meet setbacks to other hazards or that the drilling equipment can access. (email thread below)
- . Health Department Comments: I support this variance request. The reduction is minor (10') - Between the Karst geology we have and the reduction in setback the driller is planning to do a full grout of the casing that protects the water supply. The topography is that the well is at a higher elevation than septic system. I spoke with DNR and they did not oppose this variance. I would require that the old well be plugged within 60 days of the new one being installed. I am not thrilled about the location, but after going onsite and speaking with the driller there is no other location that is suitable.

Good Morning Kimberly,

I have attached an updated well permit form with correct applicant information below.

We are going to need to request a setback variance for the location of the water well to be 90' away from an existing septic system. With this well, we plan on going to at least 100' with 6" steel casing with a full neat cement grout in the entire 10" upper and large drill hole annulus. We aren't able to meet the 100' setback, as our equipment is unable to get any closer to the house due to steep inclines. Please let me know if you have any further questions.
